

Parent's Information

The Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA) is a not for profit nationally incorporated body dedicated to the recreation of pre 1600's medieval European court life. This includes martial activities, Arts and Sciences and social encounters.

The SCA endeavours to create an environment that is safe and friendly, where anyone can have fun in a medieval setting.

The SCA is **NOT** an organisation devoted to the running of events specifically for children. The SCA may conduct activities for minors or allow minors to participate in the general activities if it is safe to do so.

As a responsible parent we highly encourage you to be fully aware of the SCA activities your child will participate in. Be aware that the SCA does not have insurance that will cover accidents and injuries and in fact the indemnity you will have to sign for your child to attend SCA events identifies you as the person responsible for all costs associated with your child being injured whilst participating in SCA events.

At all times the safety and behaviour of the minor remains the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian; up to and including; that if the parent or guardian leaves the event the minor must accompany them.

Minors may not consume Alcohol, smoke tobacco or use illicit substances at SCA events. In the past those who have facilitated these activities have been banished from the Society. The minor will be asked to leave the event.

Mundane authorities may need to be involved depending on the incident.

Guardianship

If you are not attending an SCA event that your child is attending you may appoint a legal guardian for the event. To fulfill the SCA Australia Ltd's requirements you will need to find an adult (18+) full financial member of the SCA. Who understands the responsibilities of the role.

Fill in the Guardianship form for the constable, a copy for the minor to carry, you will need to fill in a minor indemnity for the event as well. Every event needs a copy for the constable, every practice needs a copy for the constable every 6 months.

Guardianship forms can last one event or for 6 months with regards to regular training and practice's.

Minor indemnities last one event or for 6 months with regards to regular training and practice's.

Remember if the paperwork isn't right the child will be asked to leave the event.
